Claire Boudreau with the Port Alberni Shelter Society manages the 172-acre farm as a social enterprise market garden. The property also hosts the Valley's first Therapeutic Recovery Community program. This site will have an assortment of veggies and herbs available for purchase as you tour the gardens.



ÉCOLE DE GRANDS-CÈDRES 5100 TEBO AVENUE

At École des Grands-cèdres, students, staff, and families aim to create a permaculture food forest that can be used by throughout the school year. The site hopes to engage students in experiential education that will cultivate lifelong healthy habits, increase school connectedness, and foster personal responsibility, stewardship, and sustainability.



THE QUACKYARD 4703 ANGUS STREET

Leo & Dave are squeezing in as much production as possible in their 5,700 sq.ft. urban plot. The site features egg-laying ducks, fibreproducing Angora rabbits, and unconventional food plants.
